To encourage our readers and supporters, and maybe jog some memories, we have included in this Special Edition, pictures of some of our past deployments along with a few stories from people who have been involved with Everyman's.

These stories are not just from those being served from our Brew Truck or one of our Rec Centres, but also from those who served as Everyman Reps or supporters. Two of those stories are shared below. (I think it is terrific that people of the calibre of John and Ella were involved with EWS when we first started in WW2; It speaks volumes for our organisation and its integrity).



Phil Marshall and I visited the Peninsula Palms Village October 2018 where we had a wonderful morning. There were approximately 50 people for morning tea, all waiting to hear about Everyman's. Phil gave everyone a summary of the work of Everyman's Welfare Service since conception.

After the meeting I was thrilled when two residents came to me and shared their own experiences with Everyman's at our Everyman's Hut in Queen Street, Brisbane during WW2. In 1944, John was going home to Tasmania from the RAAF at Cooktown. While in Brisbane, he dropped into our Everyman's Hut for a coffee and biscuits He said he felt blessed to be there. John also recalled a conversation with REP Gordon BLAIR who was in charge at the time.

My second chat was with Ella who shared that she and her sister Maisey belonged to the Clayfield Brethren Assembly. Between 1940 and 1945, they both volunteered their time on Saturday and Sunday afternoons to serve coffee, tea, biscuits and a 'Chat' to our brave

Armed Forces Personnel. Ella stated the Everyman's Hut in Queen Street was located at 'The Charlton Newsreel Theatre'. She recalled going to Gordon Blair's wedding to a New Zealand lass.

Food for thought: "I wonder if Gordon Blair realized at the time the impact he had on John and Ella? Not just them but the 1000s of other troops that flowed through the Hut?"

I think this is a powerful reminder for us never to underestimate the power of the 'Chat'. If John and Ella remember so well after 75 years, I wonder what effects the conversations had by all our Reps over the years around a cup of Brew have had on people, even today?

Another story shared with Everyman's had its beginnings at our Everyman's stall held a few years ago at the Avalon Air Show. A Vietnam Vet was wandering past and saw our emblem. He came over to say that the last time he saw our name was in Vietnam! He was so thrilled to see we were still around supporting the military; then he shared his story...

'His battalion was to be air-lifted by choppers out of a village, but after arriving at the village they were informed the Air-vac had been moved, meaning they had to walk another 6 plus hours to the new uplift site. Upon arriving at the new Airvac zone, hot, exhausted and frail, they saw the Everyman's Brew Truck all set-up, ready and waiting for them. A smile came over his face as he recounted; 'The first thing I saw as I got over that hill was the Everyman's Brew Truck parked down the bottom, just waiting for us.' He explained 'It was a sight to behold, they gave us hot tea, coffee, food, kind words and cold drinks, all free of charge, the timing was perfect.'

He then called his wife over who had been standing and watching in the background. When she arrived, he looked at the Everyman's Rep, pointed a finger his way and said, 'You are responsible for her as well you know'... After a pregnant pause leaving everyone to wonder what on earth was coming next, he cracked another big smile saying 'The Everyman's Rep running the Brew truck in 'Nam also gave us pen and paper. I wrote home to my darling sweetheart and married her on my return, and here she is', he burst out half laughing and crying, as did we all!'
